Hall of fame 2017

The High Wycombe football club Hall of Fame seeks to recognise and enshrine players, coaches, trainers and administrators that have made significant contribution to the club.

The inductees to the High Wycombe Amateur Football club Hall of Fame for 2017 are:

Dennis Waugh

Dennis has had a very long affiliation with both the High Wycombe Junior Football Club and the Amateur Football Club. At the conclusion of the 1997 season the HWAFC was essentially insolvent. Dennis was one of those people that stepped up when it counted and provided the support the Club desperately needed to get back on its feet. Dennis was that "calm voice" of experience and was always willing to share his knowledge and provide advice whenever asked. That sense of calmness saw Dennis chair a number of our AGMS and the votes cast to bring in the new Committees.

Before the Kalamunda Shire took over, Dennis for a number of years was the go to person to set-up the oval before the season started. Many an hour was also spent by Dennis throughout the season marking the oval with white paint and a dash of round-up.

Dennis was part of the working group that saw the High Wycombe Colts side introduced in the 1999 season. This is just a small part of what Dennis has contributed to High Wycombe Football over the years. Dennis received our Club Person of the Year Award in the year 2000.

Dennis was also Vice-President of the High Wycombe Junior Football Club for four years during the 1990s. In respect of his involvement with the Junior Football Club, Dennis was awarded the Swan Districts Club Person in 1993, he was awarded Club Person in 1995 and in 1997 was made a Life Member of the High Wycombe Junior Football Club.

Sherryle Scroop

The simplest way to describe Sherryle is; extremely hard-working, dedicated, a bit of a perfectionist, and never afraid to let you know when you have stuffed up. If you ever needed a job done it would be done. I think leave it there, because what I'm about to cover will pretty much sum up what this person has done for Football & Junior Sport here in High Wycombe.

Like Dennis, Sherryle had a big hand in getting this Club back on its feet following the 1997 season.

From 2010 to 2011 Sherryle served as our Treasurer, was awarded Club Person of the year 3 times being 1999, 2010, & 2011 and managed the Colts side in 2006, 2007 & 2009. But wait there is more

From 1998-2000 Sherryle served as Treasurer of the Junior Football Club, from 2001 to 2002 she served as Secretary of the Junior's and in 2012 to 2013 she did a further two-year stint as Treasurer. And this says a lot about this person. In 1999, not only was she Club Person at our club, she was also awarded Club Person of the Year of the Junior Football Club. In 2000 she received the Swan Districts Club person of the year and in 2002 she received Life Membership of the Junior Football Club.

C2 Grade Report

Without question, this season has presented all of us at the High Wycombe Football Club with a number of challenges which has tested our resolve, friendships and ultimately – love of the game and club. Winning is often more than a premiership, where you sit on the season ladder or what happens on game day. It is simply a by-product of a number of other little things working well first.

The easiest thing we can do is find excuses, blame others or avoid difficult decisions however I have been continually impressed by the strength of the players who joined or stayed with us, our members and supporters. At many times this year, the easy way out would have been to stay away, not train knowing you would get a game or possibly quit. But to the true believers, the one who committed and continued to work hard both on and off the field I have nothing but respect.

The most pleasing aspect of each week was to see a level of progress which although did not reach the reward we were seeking; I would like to think that we are richer for the experience. I also am confident we will use this to develop a particular hunger for next season knowing that at our best, we were able to match it with a number of sides; however, our ability to maintain this for the whole game was where we were exposed. Likewise, the level of development on a number of players over the season was a credit to their work rate and buy-in to the team. At times, it was like a playground with strong opinions on what should be happening, inflated belief in individual's capacity and simple bitching about things that we couldn't control but once players started directing energy on what they could the real growth began.

With over 70 players rolling through the league team this year it was difficult to find a level of consistency or understanding among each other but the reverse of this was the joy in seeing men make their league debut, milestone games or have an opportunity which may not have otherwise been afforded. What I do know is that every one of the 70 played for a love of the game and High Wycombe jumper. The football field is a very difficult place to hide and on the back of a number of our losses the players were the ones who carried the weight of defeat more than many may realise. As men, it was a credit to witness their individual strengths as what was important after the game and our ability to look each other in the eye and know that were never beaten on effort, rather being accepting of the notion that were beaten by a better side. A single game or season does not define us.

Coaching is a two-way process and change takes time with the progression different for each individual. We all embrace the steps of understanding, acceptance, application and implementation differently. Likewise, I have had to listen and absorb feedback, weigh it on its merits to improve the team as a whole and adapt as necessary. It is the same expectation. Within the team, the highlights usually happen in the oddest of moments or opportunities and what I will take from the season is some somewhat funny and inappropriate moments on game day, in the change rooms and on the training track; as well as hopefully teaching players greater aspects of the game along the way.

Taking a side from one coach to another is no easy task, especially from one so highly regarded within High Wycombe! We made a deliberate decision at the commencement of the season to preserve the colts players in order to keep them together, not to artificially accelerate their development and give them every opportunity for finals success. This was also balanced with making selection decisions to provide a level of exposure for their longer-term growth of where they need to be in order to become successful 200 game league players for High Wycombe. At the same time, we placed a higher level of expectation on our senior players to carry heavy workloads through the season as we implemented a rotation system through the midfield and around the ground.

I am very appreciative that clubs do not function in isolation and they simply do not operate without a number of people doing a range of simple and big things in order to make them work. Some of these are obvious and others not so, but I, along with the playing group, have appreciated the efforts at all levels. It is always unwise to start listing individuals but please know that I have noticed, hopefully acknowledged where appropriate, and treated all members the same along the way. This includes our Team Manager, Trainers, Umpires and the various players that assisted as Team Runner or Water Carriers during the season. It would be remiss of me not to specifically mention my other coaches who have been with me in the front row of the rollercoaster listening, challenging, negotiating and understanding all aspects of the journey, likewise, my wife Anna and family who have provided the necessary balance during the season.

In terms of the future, the club is well placed but it will ultimately be determined by the players and the level of commitment, expectation and intensity they demand from each other. It is this that they are all capable of and will be what drives the next phase of the club's resurgence and growth. It would be tempting to chase an easier option at another club, but I believe the rewards will be superficial and a little empty when compared to what High Wycombe can offer next season.
